

Background The Foundation is a North Carolina Corporation chartered in 1999. It is a public non-profit tax-exempt organization having obtained its 501(c)(3) status in 2000. The Foundation has raised over \$15,000,000 and leveraged over \$16,000,000 to implement projects addressing priority natural resource issues and building conservation capacity.

Purpose The Foundation is organized to carry out the present and long term mission and purposes of the North Carolina Soil & Water Conservation Districts that locally address statewide conservation needs.

Mission The Foundation’s mission is to promote, protect and improve North Carolina soil and water resources for the enhancement of economic growth and stewardship of the natural environment.

Structure The Foundation is governed by a 20+ person board of directors and is managed by a two person staff with project managers added as needed.

Objectives The Foundation’s objectives focus on three major priority areas: Building Conservation Capacity, Educating the Citizens, and Improving the Natural Environment
